Abstracts for proposals should not exceed 500 words and must be submitted, along with a concise biographical note (maximum 200 words), to dhh@dariah.hr by 25 August. We welcome submissions of completed, original, and unpublished research, as well as contributions presenting work in progress.

Authors of selected papers will be invited to prepare a submission for an edited, peer-reviewed volume.
